#### **Pastor's Paragraphs**

Our synod bishop, Rev. Dr. Lee Miller, traveled to the Holy Land in January. He went at the invitation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land. A couple pastors are currently serving there who used to be in New York. You probably remember me saying in the past that when it comes to Israeli/Palestinian conflict the Lutheran church is solidly on the side of the Palestinians. Christians make up less than 2% of the population in Palestine. Only a fraction of that 2% is Lutheran. One could argue that with such a small population being Lutheran they are hardly worth noting. Indeed there are only six Lutheran congregations in the area.

Yet get this. Four of those six congregations run schools. They are among the best in the region. Also, Augusta Victoria Lutheran Hospital is the premier healthcare provider in the area. Fully 60% of the population of Palestine relies on that hospital. So, even though Lutherans make up a insignificant part of the population, we have an outsized importance. The Palestinians love the Lutheran Church. The government of Israel, however,... that's a different story.

Hang on to that thought as we look at the ministry of Jesus. Jesus brought healing and restoration to life everywhere he went. He advocated for the poor and helpless. He sought to empower people who had no power. Jesus' ministry was built upon loving all people and seeing their value. We'd expect such a person to be loved by all. But you know the story well as we are coming into Holy Week. When Jesus is in the presence of the rich and powerful of his day it doesn't take them long to decide to do away with him!

The current leaders of the Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land walk a very fine line. The Israeli government doesn't like them and is looking for any excuse to declare the Lutheran Church a terrorist organization. Yes, you read that correctly. The Lutheran Church there runs the daily risk of being classified as a terrorist organization. They have no weapons. They do not plan destructive acts. They intend to help and not hurt. If they say nothing about the way they are being persecuted then they are not heard. If they speak up too loudly or act too publicly they will be so labeled. The schools would have to close and so would the hospital.

During the bishop's visit, he and other Lutheran leaders from the United States were kept at a low profile. Their movements were limited. Sometimes they even met with Christians in unmarked buildings down side allies for safety sake.

As we approach Easter I encourage you to keep the Christians in Palestine in your prayers. Realize that the dynamics of our Lord Jesus are still being played out in our own time. Those who seek to teach, to heal, and to worship may still end up being labeled terrorists. For even teaching healing and worshipping can be a threat to those in power.


