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First Reading Ephesians 5:8-14

A: ⁸For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light— ⁹for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. ¹⁰Try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord. ¹¹Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. ¹²For it is shameful even to mention what such people do secretly; ¹³but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, ¹⁴for everything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says, "Sleeper, awake! Rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you." *After the reading the reader may say:* The Word of the Lord

C: Thanks be to God.

Introduction to the Gospel Reading

Gospel Reading John 9

B: As [Jesus] walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. ²His disciples asked him,

D: "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

B: ³Jesus answered,

E: "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him. ⁴We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. ⁵As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

B: ⁶When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva and spread the mud on the man's eyes, ⁷saying to him,

E: "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam"

B: (which means Sent). Then he went and washed and came back able to see.

⁸The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar began to ask,

C: "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?"

B: ⁹Some were saying,

C: "It is he."

B: Others were saying,

C: "No, but it is someone like him."

B: He kept saying,

F: "I am the man."

B: ¹⁰But they kept asking him,

C: "Then how were your eyes opened?"

B: ¹¹He answered,

F: "The man called Jesus made mud, spread it on my eyes, and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' Then I went and washed and received my sight."

B: 12They said to him,

C: "Where is he?"

B: He said.

F: "I do not know."

B: ¹³They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. ¹⁴Now it was a sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes. ¹⁵Then the Pharisees also began to ask him how he had received his sight. He said to them,

F: "He put mud on my eyes. Then I washed, and now I see."

B: ¹⁶Some of the Pharisees said,

C: "This man is not from God, for he does not observe the sabbath."

B: But others said,

C: "How can a man who is a sinner perform such signs?"

B: And they were divided. ¹⁷So they said again to the blind man,

C: "What do you say about him? It was your eyes he opened."

B: He said.

F: "He is a prophet."

B: ¹⁸The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight ¹⁹and asked them,

C: "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?"

B: ²⁰His parents answered,

G: "We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; ²¹but we do not know how it is that now he sees, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age. He will speak for himself."

B: ²²His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews; for the Jews had already agreed that anyone who confessed Jesus to be the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue. ²³Therefore his parents said, "He is of age; ask him." ²⁴So for the second time they called the man who had been blind, and they said to him,

C: "Give glory to God! We know that this man is a sinner."

B: ²⁵He answered,

F: "I do not know whether he is a sinner. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."

B: ²⁶They said to him,

C: "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?"

B: ²⁷He answered them,

F: "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?"

B: ²⁸Then they reviled him, saying,

C: "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. ²⁹We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from."

B: 30The man answered,

F: "Here is an astonishing thing! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes. ³¹We know that God does not listen to sinners, but he does listen to one who worships him and obeys his will. ³²Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. ³³If this man were not from God, he could do nothing."

B: ³⁴They answered him,

C: "You were born entirely in sins, and are you trying to teach us?"

B: And they drove him out.

- ³⁵Jesus heard that they had driven him out, and when he found him, he said,
- E: "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"
- B: ³⁶He answered.
- F: "And who is he, sir? Tell me, so that I may believe in him."
- B: ³⁷Jesus said to him.
- E: "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he."
- B: ³⁸He said,
- F: "Lord, I believe."
- B: And he worshiped him.
- ³⁹Jesus said,
- E: "I came into this world for judgment so that those who do not see may see, and those who do see may become blind."
- B: 40Some of the Pharisees near him heard this and said to him,

C: "Surely we are not blind, are we?"

- B: 41 Jesus said to them,
- E: "If you were blind, you would not have sin. But now that you say,
- 'We see,' your sin remains.
- B: The word of the Lord
- C: Thanks be to God.
