# The Prophets - Nahum

August 8, 2021

10:30 Service of the Word

Nahum is an 7<sup>th</sup> century B.C.E. prophet who spoke against Nineveh, the capitol of the Assyrian Empire. Assyria had been growing for centuries and conquered many lands. Among their conquests was the northern Jewish kingdom of Israel. At the time of Nahum Assyria had become weak. It's doom seeming immanent. Nahum's words from God are words of harsh condemnation- among the harshest words in the Bible. We'll explore their harshness and what they mean for us in worship today.
