A: Praise to you, O God, who holds our joy and sorrow. You bring water to parched ground and life out of death. Bless us as this light grows, and send sorrow and sighing to flee away. Give us strength and patience, trusting that you are true to your promises. Transform the lives of all who suffer with your wonders near at hand.

C: Amen

As the third candle on the wreath is lit we sing: Oh Come, Oh Come, Emmanuel (For music turn to Hymn 257 in the Red Hymnal)

1. Oh come, Oh come Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear.

Refrain: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to you, O Israel.

3. O come, O come, O Lord of might, as to your tribes on Sinai's height

in ancient times you gave the law in cloud and majesty and awe. Refrain

4. O come, O Branch of Jesse, free your own from Satan's tyranny; from depths of hell your people save, and give them vict'ry o'er the grave. Refrain

First Reading Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11

B: The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me;

he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted,

to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners;

²to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;

³to provide for those who mourn in Zion to give them a garland instead of ashes,

the oil of gladness instead of mourning,

the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.

They will be called oaks of righteousness,

the planting of the Lord, to display his glory.

⁴They shall build up the ancient ruins,

they shall raise up the former devastations;

they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.

⁸For I the Lord love justice,

I hate robbery and wrongdoing;

I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.

⁹Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples;

all who see them shall acknowledge

that they are a people whom the Lord has blessed.

¹⁰I will greatly rejoice in the Lord,

my whole being shall exult in my God;

for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

¹¹For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

After the reading the reader may say: The Word of the Lord

C: Thanks be to God.

<u>Scripture Poetry</u> Psalm 126 (read responsively)

D: The Lord brings us back to Zion, we are like dreamers, laughing, dancing, with songs on our lips.

C: Other nations say,

"A new world of wonders! the Lord is with them."

D: Yes, God works wonders. Rejoice! Be glad!

C: Lord, bring us back as water to thirsty land.

D: Those sowing in tears reap, singing and laughing.

C: They left weeping, weeping, casting the seed.
They come back singing, singing, holding high the harvest.

Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

D: [Paul writes] ¹⁶Rejoice always, ¹⁷pray without ceasing, ¹⁸give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. ¹⁹Do not quench the Spirit. ²⁰Do not despise the words of prophets, ²¹but test everything; hold fast to what is good; ²²abstain from every form of evil.

²³May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. ²⁴The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this.

After the reading the reader may say: The Word of the Lord

C: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading Luke 1:26-38

The gospel is announced:

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke 1st chapter.

C: Glory to you O Lord.

²⁶In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God, ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."
