Pastor's Paragraphs

Winter skies are great for stargazing. The colder air tends to be less hazy than summer's warm air. The stars seem brighter. Even if you only have a few minutes make it a point to look up and see the stars. Realize the vast expanse of the universe around you. Though science fiction makes it seem like we could someday travel to the stars, the truth is we never will. The distances are just too great. The universe is infinite. In the grand scheme of the universe we are puny beyond puny. Even the greatest atomic explosion we humans could muster – while it would certainly do damage to earth's environment – is as nothing in the vast universe.

When we realize how small and weak we really are we are then in a position to realize how truly amazing it is that God came to live a lifetime in our limited form. Though the universe is infinite, God is even bigger; even though such a statement makes no sense. We need to remember that God is simply beyond anything our minds can conceive. It is absolutely, totally, completely impossible for us to grasp even the tiniest notion of God's nature. We truly are miniscule.

Psalm 8:4-6 reminds us of this:

"When I look to the heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars which thou has established; what are humans that you are mindful of them, and the son of man that thou dost care for him?"

It is only by God's gracious love that God created us in the first place, and that God even cares about us at all. But of course God does far more than just create us and care about us. When God came in the form of Jesus it really was an amazing statement of our value. Philippians 2 reminds us:

"...though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of humans."

But of course through Jesus God does more than just give our limited form dignity by being born like us. Philippians 2 goes on:

"And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient to death, even death on a cross." So look to the stars. Realize how small you are. And be in awe that God sees you, knows you, loves you enough to want to be like you, and is even willing to sacrifice for you. 

1. Name two of the four disciples Jesus called when they were fishing along the Sea of Galilee (also called the Lake of Gennesaret)


2. What tax collector made a great feast for Jesus after Jesus called him to be a disciple?
