Pastor's Paragraphs

As we head through January our Bible readings in worship put prophesies into action. We're continuing through Luke's gospel. Prior to this we've heard predictions from Mary the mother of Jesus and Zechariah the father of John the Baptist. We also heard from Simeon, Anna, religious leaders, and a whole crowd. The anticipation has been growing. We know something big is going to happen!

Then it does happen! As we'll be reading in January, John the Baptist has huge crowds coming to him in the wilderness. He is preaching a mighty message of repentance. Then Jesus comes and is baptized. He then heads into the wilderness to be tested by the devil. January will end with Jesus preaching in his hometown and getting quite a reaction from the hometown crowd. Things are changing. God's kingdom is breaking in!

But I suspect we will not be feeling such an inbreaking in our own lives through January. It will be New Years. People will make resolutions, keep them for a little while, and then break them. The pandemic will continue on with no end in sight. Politics will remain as polarized as ever. There will continue to be weather emergencies, murders, financial scandals, and on and on.

Wouldn't it be great if in the news we heard of God's kingdom breaking in and then learning of its progress as goodness spreads noticeably in the world? Even if it was very slow and arduous progress it would still be progress. it's goodness spreading noticeably in the world!

Matthew's gospel says that the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light. Where is that light? Why does it not seem to shine more brightly? If anything, as churches and faith continue to decline in the western world, it seems like the light is fading.

But it is not. God's light is shining just as brightly as ever. Whether the news reports it or not God's kingdom is still breaking in and spreading throughout the world. When life seems exhausting because problems don't seem to go away remind yourself that God is active despite what is visible.

The farther we journey into Luke's gospel the more we will see that not everyone is seeing the light. Many are rejected it. Many are opposed to God's kingdom. And of course ultimately, it looks like Jesus' mission has failed utterly. Those opposed to Jesus think they have triumphed when they kill him.

But God was not done. God was active all along. And God has brought about the exact outcome God wanted to accomplish.

I know is can be hard, but truly trust that God knows what God is doing. Deep in the fabric of the stories of Jesus we realize that God's purposes remain unseen in the larger world. But those who dare to hope do find it; although it is hard.

Remember, no task worth doing is easy. God's kingdom is the most worthwhile task there is. In 2022 continue to work for God's kingdom. Press against all who would destroy God's loving purposes. Give, love, help, and forgive as much as you possibly can. God will certainly be working through you! Blessings,

Missionaries Updates

We have been supporting two missionaries for the past several years. The Rev. Matthew Nickoloff is leading the South Wedge Mission in Rochester. This is a joint venture between the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester and our own synod to provide a presence in the South Wedge at the place where Peace Lutheran used to be. The new congregation has had its ups and downs but has developed enough to soon be considered and independent congregation. Congratulations and blessings to them!

The Rev. Karen Anderson is a missionary to Chile. From 1982 to 2000 she founded and directed Educacion Popular en Salud (Popular Education for Health). In 2009 she returned to help the program develop into an international presence. Since then they have grown to 187 participants in 25 countries. Due to the pandemic Karen was called back to the United States. She continues to work remotely from here and hopes to return as soon as possible.
