Pastor's Paragraphs

2023 in review:

- -War in Ukraine. War in Gaza. And plenty more... World Population Review lists 32 countries currently at war. The majority of nations on the African continent are currently involved in either outright war or serious armed conflict.
- -The United Nations estimates 108.4 million people were forcibly displaced as of 2022. The 2023 estimates haven't been made yet.
- -NOAA estimates the 2023 hurricane season caused \$57 billion in damage.
- -CNN estimates wildfires are causing somewhere between \$394 billion and \$893 billion in losses to the United States economy each year.

How did 2023 go for you? Considering the above statistics, you're probably thinking it went comparatively well! That is something to be thankful for! But before I go on I want to note two more things.

- (1) I've had a growing number of parents express their frustration and exhaustion with their kids' schedules. Sports, music, drama, and other extracurricular activities are scheduled morning, noon, and night seven days a week, twelve months of the year. It is outright impossible to keep up with the schedules of multiple children. Backing off from any of it puts their kids at a serious disadvantage.
- (2) And finally, many people who have jobs are commenting that they are expected to work, or make themselves available for work, seven days a week.

There is no wonder mental and physical health is suffering!

In the first months of 2024 we're going to be reading through Mark's gospel during worship. Mark pulls the rug out from under the world order of his day. His writing can do the same for this day too. Mark simply sees the world on the wrong track. He critiques Judaism, Greek mythology, philosophy (and science), wealth, power, privilege... you name it. Mark's gospel takes aim at it! He critiques it all through the crucifixion of Jesus.

It would be wrong to say that Mark offers solutions for a world that is going out of control. He doesn't. But he does offer a different way of viewing the world. Mark can give a faith-filled and fresh perspective on our world. It is one that is sorely needed.

If you're in worship regularly, or if you're reading Mark's gospel on your own, notice that he challenges many assumptions. He reshapes things in a faith perspective. While that doesn't necessarily give answers, it does give a constructive response.

I hope things in 2024 improve in the world. Time will tell. But Mark's gospel will help us make the parts of the world we influence better places for all. Blessings, Pastor Jon





