Pastor's Paragraphs

St. Paul wrote to the Galatians, "There is no longer Jew nor Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." (3:28) This has been quoted many times before, especially by those advocating for racial and gender equality. I believe it can indeed be appropriately used for that. However, I do not believe it is appropriate to use it as a theological pile driver, nor as a weapon to serve one's political agenda.

Paul writes similar things elsewhere. In Colossians 3:11 we find, "There is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!" Then in 1 Corinthians 12:14 we find, "For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

The key to applying all of these statements is to understand the thinking behind them. That we discover in Romans 3:9 and following:

"What then, Are we any better off? No, not at all; for we have already charged that all, both Jews and Greeks, are under the power of sin, as it is written: 'There is no one who is righteous, not even one; there is no one who has understanding, there is no one who seeks God. All have turned aside, together they have become worthless; there is no one who shows kindness, there is not even one." This sets up Paul's argument that all are in need of the grace of God.

We should be shocked and offended by the racial attacks and killings that are becoming all too common in our nation. We should work so that social and legal structures that oppress people be lifted, and that all have the opportunity to work to their fullest potential. But we do not do so from the perspective of pride and superiority. We always do so from the point of humility. Ultimately what *unites* us to all other human beings is our common failing before God, and our need of God's unmerited favor. It follows that what *makes us equal* to all other humans is also this need for God's unmerited favor.

St. Paul's writings even undermine us when we think that by our own nature we are somehow good. No, Paul would say that even our desires for goodness are an inspiration by God's grace. Remember the beginning of that Romans quote, "There is no one who is righteous, not even one."

I believe the best way for our society to move forward with our highly divided understandings of race and gender is to start not with a claim of righteousness over and above someone else. No, but to start with a common understanding of brokenness. There is no room for arrogance or superiority when everyone realizes their mutual neediness.

Do I expect there to be some great wave of kindness that will come upon our nation and smooth things over? No. That would be wishful thinking to the point of absurd. But I do hope that all of us can approach such things with a common recognition of our need for grace. By recognizing that common need we will be ready to journey forward together into the future. For that community is what God's desires have been all along. Blessings,


