## Pastor's Paragraphs

You may have seen the “He gets us” ads that ran during the Super Bowl. You may have seen them elsewhere too. At first thought it seems like the huge audience of the Super Bowl is the perfect time to proclaim the gospel. The ads used are simple, just black and white scenes from ordinary life. The message is, “He gets us”. Acceptance. Peace. Love. There’s no judgment. No condemnation. But the campaign has raised a lot of eyebrows. On the whole it seems to be backfiring. It is not drawing people towards Jesus but pushing them away. The question has certainly been raised, is it a good idea to spend so much money on a TV campaign when that money could be used to help people elsewhere? I know little about the campaign, but it appears to be funded by people who’s views of Christianity I find troublesome. (It could be a bait and switch kind of thing.)

Regardless of the theology behind the ads, or if it is a good use of money, I find it to be a misguided approach. How did Jesus approach evangelism? How did the early church grow? It was always face-to-face, one person at a time. There were no ad campaigns, no press releases, no intentional mass gatherings. While all of those things can have their place, they are not our primary evangelism tool. Christian faith spreads by personal contact. It is when one person shares with another person something very simple and basic. That very simple thing is where you find your life’s meaning.

Churches too often think they have to compete with the splash and polish of high priced media. While it is true that we need to do things well, it is foolish to compete. Things with splash and polish are actually usually selling something that will not give lasting fulfillment. Lasting fulfillment is not flashy. It comes through authentic connection.

May you have the courage and the insight to spread the gospel through your personal day to day interactions. Be honest about who you are, and do not be afraid to share where your life gets its meaning.
