#### **Pastor's Paragraphs**

Daniel Defoe made this little poem based upon an old German phrase popularized by Martin Luther:

Whenever God erects a house of prayer, the devil always builds a chapel there; and 'twill be found, upon examination, the latter has the largest congregation.

(Luther's Works, Volume 21, Pg. 212) Perhaps the Third Law of Physics (for every action there is an equal and opposite reaction) even applies to humanity!

It is a sad truth that everything that has potential for good is also twisted for bad. I've preached any number of sermons that point out that even our very best intentions cause problems down the road. For example, basic healthcare and vaccinations leads to lower infant mortality rates. But that just increases humanity's overpopulation of the earth! There is no way out of this. There never will be. And we humans are rarely acting at our best.

God is an infinite step ahead of us.

The Gospel of Mark, which we are reading in worship this year, points this out. While we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus with Easter at the end of this month, Mark's gospel has minimal use for the resurrection. He doesn't even bother to include any appearances of Jesus after the resurrection! Instead, Mark is all about Good Friday – Jesus' death.

It would be wrong to say that for every bad action there is a corresponding good action, but Jesus' execution at the hands of humans is as bad as we can be. There is simply no way for the devil to turn Good Friday into anything worse! In the crucifixion God did not erect a house of prayer. God tore apart the fabric of reality as we know it! The devil could do no worse. Love, in its purest, most perfect form, was expressed. And evil couldn't turn it into something bad.

The Easter message is wonderful. God is triumphant! But that is an easy playground for the devil to build a chapel. Perhaps that is why Mark's gospel downplays it so much. Easter can go wrong more ways than we can imagine. And while we certainly need the resurrection (Mark's gospel doesn't deny that), Jesus' crucifixion creates the impossible bind for evil; which is its ultimate downfall. So, while we continue to live in the impossible trap of sin, God has ultimately rescued us from it. We know full well that even the very our best actions will be twisted. But, we do them anyway as reflections of the love God has for us. It is by grace we are saved, not the value of our actions. And it is by grace that people turn to the love of God – which really is the only real hope we have. That is a very good hope indeed! Blessings, Pastor Jon


10:30 Worship Service


