

First Reading Genesis 1:26-31

²⁶Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." ²⁷So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. ²⁸God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth."

²⁹God said, "See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. ³⁰And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. ³¹God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good..

Scripture Poetry Psalm 90:1-12 (read responsively)

A: You have been our haven, Lord, from generation to generation.

C: Before the mountains existed, before the earth was born, from age to age you are God.

A: You return us to dust, children of earth back to earth.

C: For in your eyes a thousand years are like a single day: they pass with the swiftness of sleep.

A: You sweep away the years as sleep passes at dawn,

C: Like grass that springs up in the day and is withered by evening.

A: For we perish at your wrath, your anger strikes terror.

C: You lay bare our sins in the piercing light of your presence.

A: All our days wither beneath your glance, our lives vanish like a breath.

C: Our life is a mere seventy years, eighty with good health, and all it gives us is toil and distress; then it breaks and we are gone.

A: Who can know the force of your anger? Your fury matches our fear.

C: Teach us to make use of our days and bring wisdom to our hearts.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 6:12-20

[Paul writes] "All things are lawful for me," but not all things are beneficial. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be dominated by anything. ¹³ "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food," and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is meant not for fornication but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. ¹⁴And God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. ¹⁵Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Should I therefore take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! ¹⁶Do you not

know that whoever is united to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For it is said, "The two shall be one flesh." ¹⁷But anyone united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. ¹⁸Shun fornication! Every sin that a person commits is outside the body; but the fornicator sins against the body itself. ¹⁹Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own? ²⁰For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body.

C: Thanks be to God.

<u>Gospel Acclamation</u> (1 Corinthians 2:12)

C: Alleluia. We have received not the spirit of the world, but that Spirit that is from God. Alleluia.

Gospel Reading Matthew 12:46-50

The gospel is announced:

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 12th chapter.

C: Glory to you O Lord.

⁴⁶While [Jesus] was still speaking to the crowds, his mother and his brothers were standing outside, wanting to speak to him. ⁴⁷Someone told him, "Look, your mother and your brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you." ⁴⁸But to the one who had told him this, Jesus replied, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" ⁴⁹And pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! ⁵⁰For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."
