#### **Pastor's Paragraphs**

Since there are political ads everywhere you turn it's hard to avoid the anxiety around the upcoming election! It's also hard to know what to believe. While I am likely to believe our local officials, the higher up the political ladder you go the less I believe what they say. It appears as if their words are more calculated and strategic than honest.

As a contrast to this sea of tension and dishonesty we're going to focus on the book of Ephesians in worship during September and October. Ephesians gives us solid foundational truths about the nature of faith, the act of salvation by Jesus, and the purpose of the church. Ephesians is not a specific letter written to one church to deal with a particular problem. It is a general letter to several churches. It addresses general struggles of faith. It doesn't give lists of dos and don'ts. Rather, it gives principles to live by. The readers are told how to live in a society that is not in line with their faith. They are warned about some people's trickery and craftiness in deceitful scheming. They are told that to do good works is their purpose in life. All things are to be done with honesty and integrity. They are also told that God has a cosmic plan that is surely coming about; and that they can have a part in it.

Ephesians gets into complicated things. It is not always easy to understand. Yet with some study it can be made clear. Ultimately, Ephesians calls on us to trust God and that God is surely at work. In other words, Ephesians is a good book for us to read today! I hope you find it a calming and meaningful book for our worship services in the months ahead. Blessings, Pastor Jon

We hope to introduce a more contemplative mood to these services and see how it goes.
