Pastor's Paragraphs

"Real strength never impairs beauty or harmony, but it often bestows it; and in everything imposingly beautiful, strength has much to do with the magic." -Herman Melville (*Moby Dick*, Chapter 86) Would that our political leaders would take such advice! All too often people want to use strength to impose their will upon others. They seek to build themselves up at the expense of others. This leads to destruction and ugliness. It sets into motion a pattern of revenge.

Others seek strength for protection. This may feel like an innocent use of strength at first, but it is not. Those who build fortresses around themselves are filling their lives with fear. They invest everything in protection and are unwilling to take risks. Ultimately this is selfishness and it hoards resources that could be used in better ways. People like this end up living in fearful despair.

Jesus witnesses to us the right way to use strength, for indeed his strength creates beauty. Did Jesus ever use his power to overwhelm someone or to punish them? No. Did Jesus use his power to protect himself against harm? No. Jesus' power was always used to provide for others and to restore them to health. Thus he used his strength to create beauty.

As the Easter season stretches all through April and well into May we remember the great power of the miracle of the resurrection. That truly was an expression of strength that created beauty. It is an inspiration for all our lives as well. May we use strength as God does, to create beauty, to empower others, and to make them more complete. Using strength in this way is hard and takes some work, but it is worth it. In so doing we also discover our true and beautiful selves.

World Hunger Barns


