

10:30 Service of the Word

Today we look at the second of the "seven signs" Jesus performs in John's gospel. An official will approach Jesus as Jesus returns to Galilee and ask Jesus to heal his son, who is sick at home. Jesus agrees and the boy is healed. It all seems simple enough, but there is more here than meets the eye. We'll explore the background of this sign and discover its application to our own lives.

Prelude and Announcements

Thanksgiving for Baptism

P: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

C: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

P: Just as God's work of creation never ends, so the gifts received in baptism are renewed every day. Let us give thanks together for the life given in baptism.

We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of life: for water to bathe in, and for water to drink, for the rain, the snow, and the water in the ground.

C: We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of life.

P: We give you thanks, O God for the waters of this place: the Finger Lakes, the Genesee River, and Lake Ontario; for waters to play in and waters that inspire wonder, for water that gives life to our planet.

C: We give you thanks, O God, for the waters of wonder.

P: We give you thanks for the waters of baptism, and for all who gather in this place; for godparents and baptismal sponsors, for children and grandchildren, for our brothers and sisters in Christ whom we have never seen but to whom we are bound.

C: We give you thanks for the life of all the baptized.

P: We give you thanks, O God, for water, for life, for grace, for forgiveness, for resurrection and for eternal life.

C: We give you thanks, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. Amen.

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you.

Gathering Dialog (Romans 10)

A1: The word is near you,

A2: If you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord,

C: and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

A3: Faith comes from what is heard,

C: and what is heard comes through the word of Christ.

A1: Let us pray...

O persistent God,

deliver me from assuming your mercy is gentle,

Pressure me that I may grow more human,

A2: Deepen my hurt until I learn to share it and myself openly, and my need honestly.

骨 WORD 骨

First Reading 2 Corinthians 4:1-6

[Paul writes] Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. ²We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God. ³And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

After the reading the reader may say: The Word of the Lord

C: Thanks be to God.

Scripture Poetry Psalm 93 (read responsively)

A: Lord, you reign with glory, draped in splendor, girt with power.

C: The world stands firm, not to be shaken,

A: for your throne, ageless God, has stood from of old.

C: Onward roll the waves, O God, onward like thunder, onward like fury.

A: Thundering above the waters, high above ocean breakers, you, God, rise with might.

C: Your decrees stand unshaken; the beauty of holiness fills your house for ever, Lord.

Gospel Acclamation (2 Corinthians 4:1)

C: Alleluia. Therefore since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. Alleluia

Gospel Reading John 4:46-54

The gospel is announced:

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 4th chapter.

C: Glory to you O Lord.

⁴⁶Then he came again to Cana in Galilee where he had changed the water into wine. Now there was a royal official whose son lay ill in Capernaum. ⁴⁷When he heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went and begged him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸Then Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe." ⁴⁹The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my little boy dies." ⁵⁰Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and started on his way. ⁵¹As he was going down, his slaves met him and told him that his child was alive. ⁵²So he asked them the hour when he began to recover, and they said to him, "Yesterday at one in the afternoon the fever left him." ⁵³The father realized that this was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he himself believed, along with his whole household. ⁵⁴Now this was the second sign that Jesus did after coming from Judea to Galilee.
