

# Bad Kings

# *August 16, 2020* 10:30 Holy Communion

Today we begin to look at the kingdom of Judah. This is the small nation that forms after the northern 11 tribes break away and form the nation of Israel. Judah sputters along for centuries slowly getting smaller and weaker. As God promised, kings from the bloodline of David continue to lead – a total of 20 kings! Several of these kings are called good. Most however, despite being descendants of David, are called "evil." We'll explore what they did that made them evil and realize that God's patience endured.

# ⊕ WORD ⊕

First Reading 2 Kings 8:16-27

<sup>16</sup>In the fifth year of King Joram son of Ahab of Israel, Jehoram son of King Jehoshaphat of Judah began to reign. <sup>17</sup>He was thirty-two years old when he became king, and he reigned eight years in Jerusalem. <sup>18</sup>He walked in the way of the kings of Israel, as the house of Ahab had done, for the daughter of Ahab was his wife. He did what was evil in the sight of the LORD. <sup>19</sup>Yet the LORD would not destroy Judah, for the sake of his servant David, since he had promised to give a lamp to him and to his descendants forever. <sup>20</sup>In his days Edom revolted against the rule of Judah, and set up a king of their own. <sup>21</sup>Then Joram crossed over to Zair with all his chariots. He set out by night and attacked the Edomites and their chariot commanders who had surrounded him; but his army fled home. <sup>22</sup>So Edom has been in revolt against the rule of Judah to this day. Libnah also revolted at the same time. <sup>23</sup>Now the rest of the acts of Joram, and all that he did, are they not written in the Book of the Annals of the Kings of Judah? <sup>24</sup>So Joram slept with his ancestors, and was buried with them in the city of David; his son Ahaziah succeeded him. <sup>25</sup>In the twelfth year of King Joram son of Ahab of Israel, Ahaziah son of King Jehoram of Judah began to reign. <sup>26</sup>Ahaziah was twenty-two years old when he began to reign; he reigned one year in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Athaliah, a granddaughter of King Omri of Israel. <sup>27</sup>He also walked in the way of the house of Ahab, doing what was evil in the sight of the LORD, as the house of Ahab had done, for he was son-in-law to the house of Ahab.

Scripture Poetry Psalm 68:33-36 (read responsibly)

A: Rulers of earth, sing to God.

A: Acknowledge the power of God who governs Israel, whose strength is in the stormclouds.

C: You inspire wonder in your temple, God of Israel, as you fill your people with power and might. Blessed be God!

#### Second Reading Hebrews 10:19-25

<sup>19</sup>Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, <sup>20</sup>by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), <sup>21</sup>and since we have a great priest over the house of God, <sup>22</sup>let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. <sup>23</sup>Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. <sup>24</sup>And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, <sup>25</sup>not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

C: Thanks be to God!

#### Gospel Acclamation (Psalm 24:10)

C: Alleluia. Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory. Alleluia.

#### Gospel Reading John 14:15-24

The gospel is announced:

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 14<sup>th</sup> chapter.

## C: Glory to you O Lord.

[Jesus said to the disciples] "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. <sup>16</sup>And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. <sup>17</sup>This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. <sup>18</sup>"I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. <sup>19</sup>In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. <sup>20</sup>On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. <sup>21</sup>They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them." <sup>22</sup>Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will reveal yourself to us, and not to the world?" <sup>23</sup>Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them

and make our home with them. <sup>24</sup>Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.
