Pastor's Paragraphs

I feel like we're living in endlessly serious times: infectious disease control, racism issues, economic stress, political elections, and more. As a contrast for this newsletter I thought I'd put together a list of witty or funny quotes from Martin Luther. Creating such a list is easy – just search for Martin Luther quotes online!

Not being born yesterday, I'm fully aware that not everything you find online is reliable! (I love those memes with Ben Franklin or Abraham Lincoln and the quote, "Don't believe everything you read on the internet just because there's a picture with a quote on it.") So, with a list brilliant quotes attributed to Luther in hand, I set out to verify them.

Some were very significant such as, "God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does." But did Luther actually say that? I have the 54 volume set of *Luther's Works* which include every statement he made that can be verified. While that quote sounds very much like Luther, it is not his.

Many love this quote of Luther, "Whoever drinks beer, he is quick to sleep; whoever sleeps long does not sin; whoever does not sin enters heaven! Thus, let us drink beer!" Yes, while this may be the beloved creed of many a college frat boy, you don't have to be a Luther scholar to know that he never made any such statement! While Luther did have his opinions about beer, he was generally pretty temperate.

It is not just the internet that is filled with spurious quotes from Luther. Most Lutheran seminaries have a statue of him. The stone bases of these statues usually have quotes. It was a standing joke at Gettysburg that only one of the several quotes was actually verifiable!

This isn't unique to Luther. Most famous people are cited as saying all sorts of things they never did. That's not necessarily bad, especially if the quote is truly in that person's style. Indeed a quote or a pithy saying can be a great boost when you're having a tough day. But in general life does not come down to short witticisms. Similarly, headlines of news articles do not capture the depth of what really happened. In tough times life can be a slow slog. Getting through life is not about finding a bunch of shortcuts. Most of Martin Luther's best thoughts cannot be simplified to a simple saying. Life takes time. It takes diligence. It takes work.

I will conclude with one verifiable saying of Luther's that does fit this time and every time:

"I have held many things in my hands, and I have lost them all; but whatever I have placed in God's hands, that I still possess." (Letter to Justus Jonas the Elder, June 29, 1530) Blessings, Pastor Jon

Sunday Worship – 2 Congregations

Beginning June 7 the congregation of St. John's, Lyons began joining the Zoom worship that St. John's, Victor had already been doing. Lyons' pastor came to the end of his call. Since no one was having in-person worship it made sense for the two congregations to share. As long as neither congregation has in-person worship it makes sense to continue this arrangement. However, July and August will bring changes. So...

Lyons - Sunday worship continues at 10:30 via Zoom with Victor. In July the Lyons council will explore options for worship in the future.

Victor - 8:30 worship has resumed using the outdoor chapel. Weekly communion will begin July 5. Communion will use wafers and pre-filled glasses. They will be placed on plates and on a table as you approach the outdoor chapel. Please pick up as many plates as you need for your household and keep them with you until communion.

10:30 – Worship continues via Zoom through the month of July. Internet upgrades are scheduled to be completed

by the end of July. This will allow services to be led from the sanctuary. In-person worship will resume in the sanctuary August 2. Communion will not be distributed for the first couple weeks. Even after inperson worship resumes the services will still include an online part by Zoom.

Hello churches!


I know some of you have heard, but we're trying to keep everyone informed about Food Cupboard news, so..

We found a new home for the Food Cupboard and signed a lease last week!! We will be sharing a building with Mozzeroni's at 4358 Anthony Drive in Victor! We will have 3 500 square foot at this location!

We will be moving in the second week in July. We will keep everyone posted when this location will open to our clients. We will continue the drive-in distribution at least until the end of summer, then will reevaluate with FoodLink's guidance.

We'll be hosting open houses by appointment (to keep gatherings small) at the end of July and the beginning of August. We'd love to have you come see the new space!!

Another way to help the Food Cupboard: The First Presbyterian Church of Victor is coordinating a summer meal kit program for families served by the Victor school district school lunch program. On Tuesdays this summer, the Food Cupboard van will be parked behind the Presbyterian Church from 8 am to 7 pm to collect items that will be needed for these meal kits. The van can also be a collection spot for fresh produce from home gardeners (the produce will be given out at the Food Cupboard on Wednesdays).


