The Fourth Sunday of Easter May 7, 2017 10:30 Holy Communion

First Reading Genesis 1:1-2:3 (read responsively)

A1: In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

A2: Then God said.

"Let there be light";

and there was light.

C: And God saw that the light was good;

A1: and God separated the light from the darkness.

⁵God called the light Day.

and the darkness he called Night.

C: And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

A2: And God said.

"Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." ⁷So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome.

And it was so.

⁸God called the dome Sky.

C: And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

A1: And God said,

"Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear."

And it was so.

¹⁰God called the dry land Earth,

and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas.

C: And God saw that it was good.

A2: Then God said, "Let the earth put forth vegetation:

plants yielding seed,

and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it."

C: And God saw that it was good.

A1: Then God said,

"Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness;

and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea,

and over the birds of the air,

and over the cattle,

and over all the wild animals of the earth,

and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth."

²⁷So God created humankind in his image,

in the image of God he created them;

male and female he created them.

²⁸God blessed them, and God said to them,

"Be fruitful and multiply,

and fill the earth and subdue it;

and have dominion over the fish of the sea

and over the birds of the air

and over every living thing that moves upon the earth."

A2: Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. ²And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done.

C: So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested

from all the work that he had done in creation.

[Jesus] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.
